Dear Evgenia,

Thank you for your email.

Israelis are not required to be in possession of a visa when entering the Schengen area. This is stated in *Regulation (EU) 2018/1806 of The European Parliament and of The Council of 14 November 2018 listing the third countries whose nationals must be in possession of visas when crossing the external borders and those whose nationals are exempt from that requirement*.

Furthermore, an Israeli Travel document is recognised as travel document for entering the Schengen area by all EU-member states as long as it allows for re-entry. This is stated in *The list of travel documents which entitle the holder to cross the external borders and which may be endorsed with a visa, divided into three parts, as well as the non-exhaustive list of known fantasy and camouflage passports, are drawn up by the European Commission with the assistance of EU Member States and Schengen Associated States on the basis of information gathered within the framework of local Schengen cooperation, as established by Decision No 1105/2011/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 25 October 2011*.

Subject: Clarification of the order of entry of Israeli citizens with Travel Document in Lieu of National Passport

Good afternoon!

My name is Evgenia, I am the head of ATLAS agency, nice to meet you.

At the request of citizens of the State of Israel, we update the list of countries and the procedure for entering them with Travel Document in Lieu of National Passport, also known as Provisional Passport. This is Israel's second official passport, which is issued exclusively to Israeli citizens and is **not** a Travel Document. It can be issued to citizens in their first year of life in the country, as well as to those who do not reside permanently in the country.

Based on the visa agreement between Israel and Sweden, holders of the Darkon can enter and stay in Sweden without a visa for up to 90 days. Can you please tell me if the conditions for visa-free stay are similar for holders of Travel Document in Lieu of National Passport?

I will be very much waiting for your official answer, have a nice day!
